## The Judgment of Paris, central field from a 2<sup>nd</sup>-century AD floor mosaic in the Atrium House, Antioch

Paris is distracted from his mixed flock by the three goddesses:

--Athena is looking intimidatingly martial with her aegis, helmet, spear, and shield beside her. Is that an owl over her head?

--Hera is sitting on a royal throne with her queenly robes and scepter.

--Aphrodite is looking winsome.

--Psyche and Cupid look on triumphantly from the top left and right corners, respectively, anticipating Aphrodite's victory.

--Paris, who appears in eastern, Phrygian dress, is consulting with Hermes who holds a caduecus and bears wings on his feet (no petasus). ML p 476 provide caption and context.
